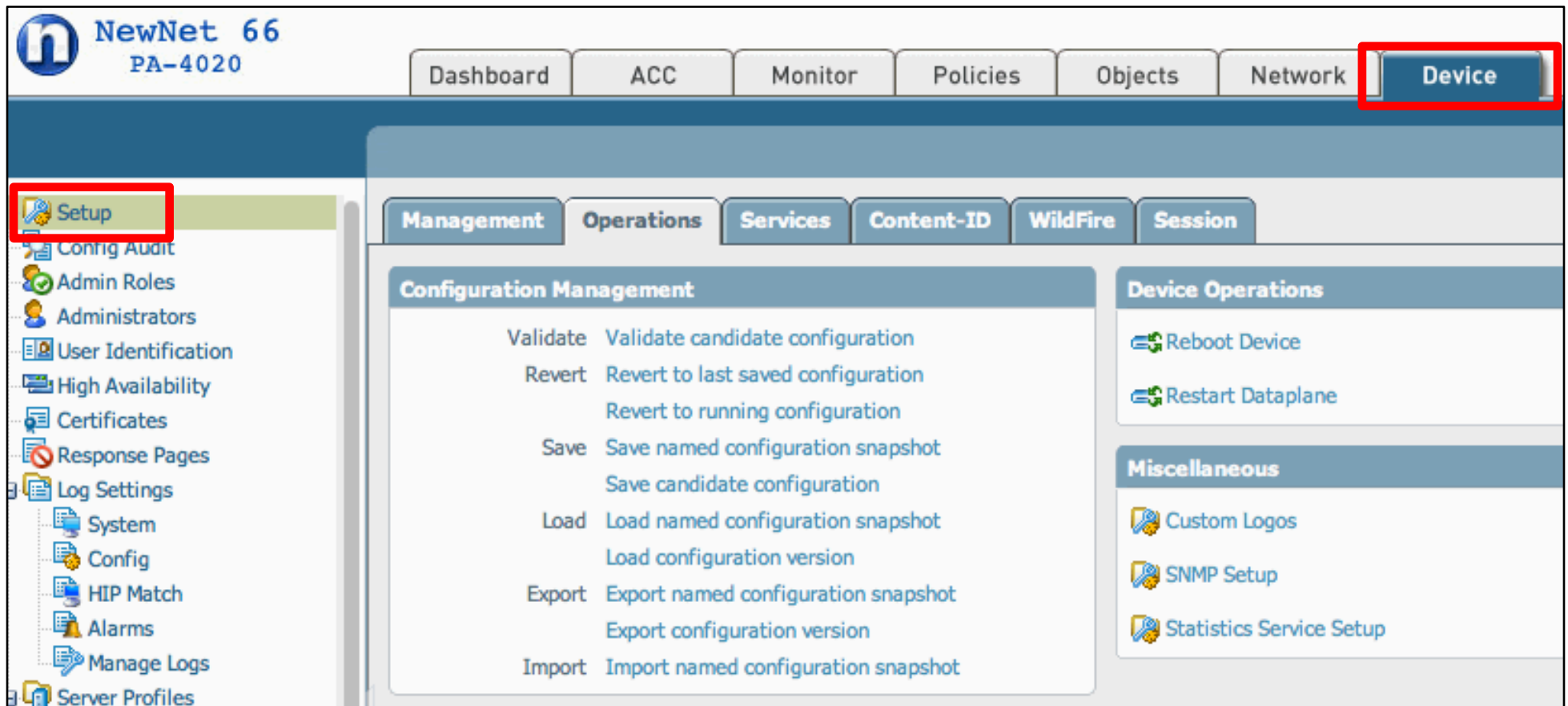


Backing up the existing configuration of your PaloAlto Networks Firewall is very straight forward.


Step #1.

Login to your PaloAlto Firewall and click on the "**Device**" tab at the top of the screen then click "**Setup**" at left.



Step #2.

Click the "Export configuration version" link at noted below.


